## **PRAYER DIARY**

May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Romans 15:5-6)

#### **MONDAY 16**

Today, Joe Crossley and Alana Wroe will be married at St John's, Ranmoor. Joe's father, Jim Crossley, will take the service. Pray that Joe and Lani might see their marriage as living not for each other but rather uniting to serve the living God together. Pray that they would seek first the kingdom that is the Lord's, and its righteousness, so that all other things may be added unto them. And, in loving the Lord best, they would love each other all the more, remaining faithful to Him so that faithful unto each other they will remain.

#### **TUESDAY 17**

Pray that we would know the Lord's abiding presence, not least when other helpers fail and earthly comforts flee. As we see change and decay all around, pray that the help of the helpless would abide with us so that our tears would have no bitterness, only joy at all he has in store for his children. Ask that our Saviour would hold the cross before our closing eyes and be our abiding comfort in life and in death

#### **WEDNESDAY 18**

Our Mission Partner, Jonny Wilkinson, is taking a short break back in the UK from his work with Samaritan's Purse (SP) in Ethiopia; he asks us to pray for the leaders of that country, especially given the conflict and unfolding humanitarian disaster in the Tigray region, and for SP's relief and development work alongside Ethiopian believers.

#### **THURDAY 19**

Pray for those who will lead us into a new chapter of life as a community of believers in this place. Ask that all who carry this onerous responsibility will be responsive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, confronting wrongs with a gentleness that evidences Jesus, encouraging the fearful, pointing the wounded to Christ and stirring up those of us prone to apathy. Pray our leaders will love us and one another with a sturdy, unrelenting love that is tempered by grace.

#### FRIDAY 20

Give thanks for the 'Building for the Future' project and for progress made with the work on the new courtyard area and inside the church building. Pray that this would continue smoothly and without interruption. Give thanks too for a significant reduction in the funding gap, for the committee who are overseeing things and for all those who have supported the project in giving and in prayer.

#### **SATURDAY 21**

The Youth Houseparty runs from tomorrow until August 27<sup>th</sup>. Give thanks to God for this opportunity to go away together and for all the planning that has been done to bring it to fruition. Pray for all those who will teach and lead, cook and organise, both upfront and behind the scenes. Pray too for safety in travelling and on site and ask that the Holy Spirit would be at work, bringing these young people to a deeper, richer, living faith.

#### **SUNDAY 22**

This morning we welcome Andy Brewerton, from St Thomas' Kilnhurst, as our guest preacher. Give thanks for Andy, and pray that the Lord would speak through him from Psalm 53, so that we would have confidence in knowing that the God of the Bible is the true and living God, ever-present and acting with perfect timing in fulfilling his purposes.

Pray that more people would feel confident to return to the in-person services and renew fellowship with one another. Pray too for those who, through the pandemic, might have become disconnected from their church family.
