Baptism: Interviews

Baptisms and Reaffirmations

Our Lord Jesus Christ suffered death on the cross and rose again from the dead for the salvation of mankind. Baptism is the outward sign of the inward reality of what he has done for us: we are united with him in his death; we are granted the forgiveness of sins; we are raised with Christ to new life in the Spirit.

Those who come for baptism, and those who are to renew their baptism vows, must affirm their allegiance to Christ and their rejection of all that is evil. Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ?

Answer: I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

Answer: I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

Answer: I renounce evil.

You must now declare before God and his Church that you accept the Christian faith into which you were baptised and into which you are about to be baptised, and in which you will all live and grow spiritually.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who made the world?

Answer: I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ, who redeemed mankind?

Answer: I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God?

Answer: I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

All: This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The Baptism

I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**

All: We receive you into Christ's congregation. We pray that you will not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified; that you will fight bravely under his banner against sin, the world and the devil; that you will continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant to the end of your life. Amen
