Discussion Questions

Isaiah 41vs1-29

'History under control'

Opening: What things might we do to cope when we are afraid?

Vv. 1-8 + 21-29: The Lord's absolute control of the future

- 1. What do we learn about the Lord's control over history in vv. 1-4?
- 2. Why are the nations fearful in v. 5? What do they do in response to their fear?
- 3. When might we be tempted to respond in a similar way?
- 4. In vv. 21-29, how is the Lord different from idols?
- 5. Why is the Lord's absolute control of the future such good news for Israel? Why is it such good news for Christians today?
- Vv. 9-20: The Lord's absolute commitment to his people
 - 6. In what ways do we see the Lord's commitment to his people in vv. 9-20?
 - 7. How might these verses comfort the people as they feared the coming exile? How can they comfort Christians today?

Summary: How can these verses help us turn to the Lord, and not idols, when we are afraid?
